Established

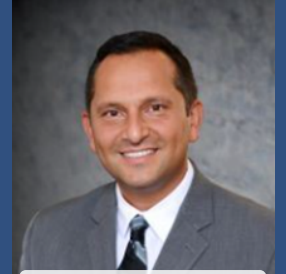

Removal of Coast Live Oak Tree at Lowell Brandt Park

Unfortunately, the City had to remove the large Coast Live Oak tree adjacent to the playground and bathroom at Lowell Brandt Park. A recent branch fall prompted the City's Public Work's Park Division to request a health assessment by the City's arborist, West Coast Arborist.

Based on the Arborist's assessment, it was advised that the tree be removed entirely, and therefore, the removal of the tree was directed by the City Manager.

The City will seek to replace the tree as soon as possible. Thank you for your understanding of the need to remove this tree due to its potential hazard to park users.

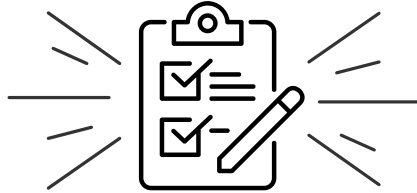

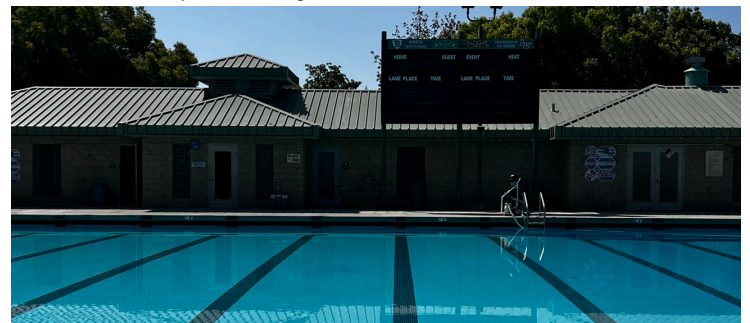


Host your Next Event with the City of La Verne

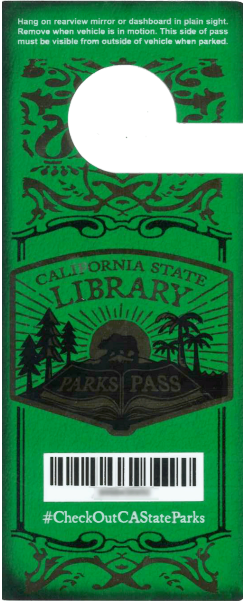


Foothill "A" Line Update

As part of the preparations to ready the 9-mile Glendora to Pomona project segment for passenger service, Metro is now running trains regularly throughout the entire project corridor, including La Verne. The La Verne station dedication on June 21, creating a spirit of excitement for the new line amongst residents and employees alike! A start date has not been announced, but fair ridership will occur prior to September 19, 2025. We are excited to see how the new line will help the City of La Verne flourish!



Did You Know...?



In partnership with the First Partner's Office and the California State Library, State Parks are providing free vehicle day-use entry to over 200 participating state park units operated by State Parks to library-card holders!

The California State Library Parks Pass is valid for entry of one passenger vehicle with capacity of nine people or less or one highway licensed motorcycle. Visit the La Verne LA County Library or Bookmobile to borrow a pass and plan your trip to a participating state park this summer!

Passes can be checked out for 2 weeks and are not renewable. Please keep in mind that while there are a great number of participating state parks and beaches, not all are included. For information on parks you can access with the pass, please visit https://www.parks.ca.gov/?page_id=30813.
