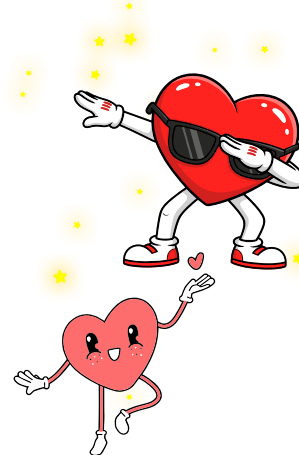

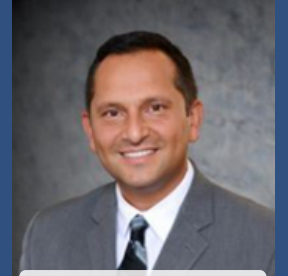

Leadership Update: New Fire Chief Announced

The City of La Verne is pleased to announce the appointment of Brandon Coatney as Fire Chief, effective January 9. His deep knowledge of the La Verne Fire Department and commitment to public safety position him well to lead the department forward while continuing strong community service.

Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) - Submit Your Feedback

The City of La Verne is updating its Local Hazard Mitigation Plan to better identify and reduce risks from natural hazards like droughts, earthquakes, extreme temperatures, flooding, and wildfires. This federally-funded plan, developed with community partners and guided by FEMA and state requirements, will help strengthen the City's resilience, qualify La Verne for mitigation funding, and guide strategies that protect lives and property. Residents are encouraged to review the draft plan, provide feedback and participate in the planning process through surveys and public meetings. Visit LaVerneCA.gov/LHMP for more information.



Sewer Rehabilitation Work Nearing Completion in La Verne



Construction on the Sewer Rehabilitation Project in La Verne is on track for completion. A new liner has been installed inside the existing concrete sewer pipe to prevent corrosion from methane and sewage gases and is designed to last at least 50 years. Crews will briefly reopen a manhole for inspection and any minor repairs, a one-day activity that may require temporary traffic control. This project is part of the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts' effort to rehabilitate approximately 18,100 feet of sewer line through San Dimas and La Verne.
